► BACKGROUND

The Brazilian Government is recognized internationally for its success in the response to the HIV epidemic. Brazil has been providing technical support on HIV/AIDS to other countries in the setting of horizontal South-South cooperation since 2002. For the Brazilian Cooperation Agency (ABC) health is a priority area. Projects are focused on capacity building and strengthen institutions and human resources.
